McElmore and Jefferson Milam two respectable Citizens his continuell residence from the 1st Jan 1836, until the present time he is therefore entitled to One League and labor of land for which this is his Certificate Given under our hands at Lagrange this 1st Febr 1838 and of the Independence of Texas the 2^d year

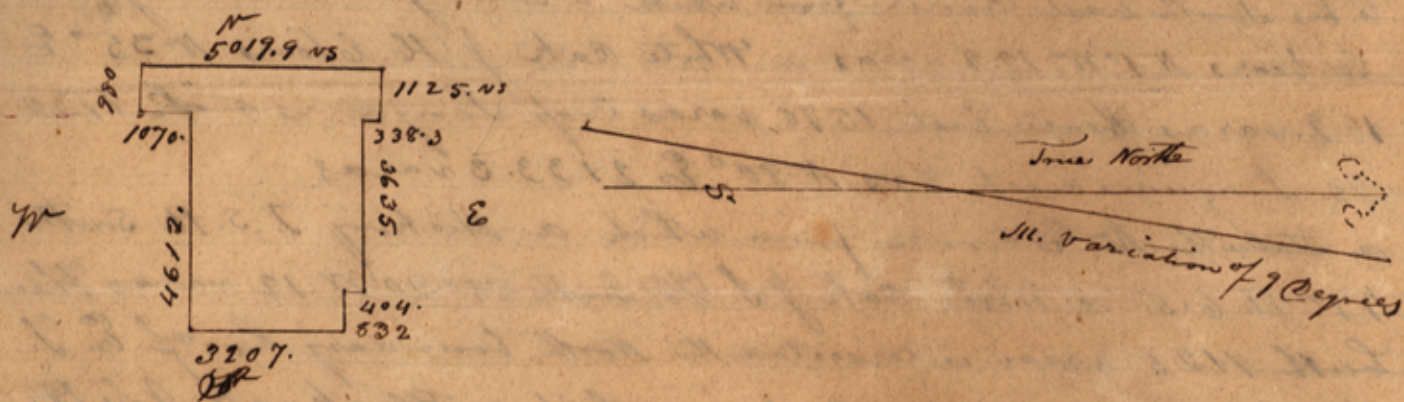
